Criticism is not easy to take. How we receive it can make all the difference. Read what James and Jerrie had to say!

James (Book of James, that is) and Jerrie (Barber)

Recently Jerrie Barber wrote the words below as a part of an article entitled, "What is your first response to criticism?"

My aim is to listen to criticism and not respond immediately. If I decide not to re-

When I decide not to reply immediately, which I try to make standard policy, I reply with, "That's interesting; let me think about it. I'll consider what you said and get back to you by . . . (date and time)."

No one likes criticism . . . well, speaking for myself, I don't. I have, however, benefited from criticism. I have also believed I have received unjust criticism. Not all criticism is created equal. But Jerrie Barber is right in his approach to receiving criticism. Listen. Otherwise, it is certain to be of no benefit, because you are not hearing what is said.

This fits well as an application of the words of James.

Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; 20 for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. (James 1:19-20 ESV).

Let us practice James 1:19-20. Especially when we might not be prone to fully listen and are quick to respond, like when we receive criticism. James has inspired words. I think Jerrie had some wise words.

F. Duane Lindsey writes, "When Crowfoot, the great chief of the Blackfoot confederacy in southern

Alberta, gave the Canadian Pacific Railroad permission to cross the Blackfoot land Medicine Hat to Calgary, he was given in return a lifetime railroad pass. Crowfoot put it in a leather case and wore it around his neck for the rest of his life. There is no record, however, that he ever availed himself the right to travel anywhere on the CPR trains.
