James Berry 1937-2019

Brother James Berry died last Thursday morning, November 7, 2019. The visitation was Sunday afternoon, November 10, followed by the funeral at 2 p.m. at the Eastern Meadows church building. He is survived by his wife Jean, son Wesley and his wife Wilma, three granddaughters, and eight great-grandchildren, four sisters and a brother. The interment was at the Stony Point church cemetery.



Brother James Berry will be remembered as a man who had one central interest and concern most of his life: the Gospel of Christ. He took to heart the great commission. He taught and baptized more than 150 people in his lifetime. Sunday afternoon at the funeral a lady introduced herself to me as someone James baptized in 2003. Immeasurable good was done in his lifetime by his evangelism. James personally knocked on every door in the neighborhoods in which they lived. He believed in giving out tracts. I know that he gave one to my barber!

Brother James Berry was also a man of strong conviction. When he had concern, he spoke up. He studied his Bible, attended lectureships, and read gospel papers. He encouraged others by passing on the gospel papers he read. James was sometimes a man of few words. He was to the point.

James greatest earthly joys were his family. He enjoyed playing the guitar and singing with his wife Jean.

We express our sympathy to James' family. We will all miss him.
