MY THOUGHTS ON THANKSGIVING

"I thought about my ways, And turned my feet to Your Testimonies" (Psalm 119:59). A thoughtful person is a thankful person. Blessed is the person who meditates on God's testimonies. COME OUT OF THE STANDS

We are in the middle of college and professional football, then basketball, then baseball, and now soccer as well. We cheer on our teams; we rejoice when a touchdown, goal, basket or home run is made. It has been said that there is one man that who could play every position perfectly, make no mistakes, never makes an error . . . but there is no way to get him to lay down his hot dog, come out of the stands and play the game. We all know that person. They are always ready to tell us about how the play should have been played, and how they could have done so much better. But it is SO much easier to talk a perfect game than it is to play one.

The Hebrew writer compares the Christian life to a race, and we are to run it and not just sit in the grandstand looking on. "Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:1-2).

According to Hebrews 12 why should we be involved, and what should motivate us? Consider the ones who went before us, and what they did to please God! They got rid of the things that would hold them back as they run the race – specifically the sin. Run with endurance – They did not quit. We cannot as well. Keep your eyes on Jesus. Follow him! Realize that he set the great example of keeping our eyes on the goal. He looked for the cross. He prepared himself to endure the cross. He despised the shame – and because he did this, he reached the goal of sitting down at the right hand of God! The world will always tell us that we can't make it! It will always try to drag us back into agreement with them. It will do all it can to keep us from our goal of being with the Father. We are to be participating in the race! We can't be onlookers. Sitting in the grandstand being critical of those who run does NOT entitle us to the prize. The church needs you – there is plenty to do.
