

INVOLVEMENT

No one reading the New Testament objectively can deny that God has a unique plan for every Christian during his life on earth. Paul states this plan most clearly in his Ephesian letter. Christians are to "speak the truth in love." And as we do, "we will grow

up in all things unto Him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work" (Ephesians 4:15-16).

A minister is a servant. Every member should become a minister. It is at this point that we often fail. The church has unlimited sources of potential in the God-given abilities of its members. Too often these abilities go untapped because of the lack of understanding by members of their resources, the failure of church to effectively use its members in the work of the kingdom, or the refusal of the members to use their God given abilities for God's service.

Satan also has a plan. His desire is to render us ineffective in the service of the kingdom. And unless we are "steadfast, immoveable, always abounding the in work of the Lord," Satan's cunning deceitful ways are successful. Observe the lack of workers and the quality of second mile



service in the kingdom and state that it isn't so. Satan uses a multiplicity of tools, but his ultimate aim is to divide and conquer. The tragedy is that we sometimes become his most effective weapons. Cynicism, apathy, gossip, and backbiting are all effective diversions from the empowering grace of God.

We are at war! Battles are won or lost in the decisions of our lives every day. Whose we are is as important as what we are! We hold the consequences in our hands! What will we do?
