Budget Area of Work Spotlight

Our budget spotlight for this week is Fellowships. Our Marriage Enrichment Fellowship function and our 1st Wednesday evening fellowship both went well. Although our fellowships have come to a screeching halt due to the virus there is a lot going on. Our April Wednesday evening fellowship for the 8th is cancelled and all our Homecoming events scheduled for May 3rd are cancelled as well.

Our budget for Fellowships for 2020 is \$850 per month. This goes to cover food, supplies, and equipment for all our fellowship events. We are running over budget \$145.59 for this year only because we just recently purchased insulated warmers and beverage dispensers to better handle all fellowship events. Based on what we know currently we should be under budget for the rest of the year.

Our Fellowship teams remain the same with the exception of new captains for each team. We have made a change in how fellowships are handled. The team that is managing a particular fellowship will be in charge of set-up, serving, and clean-up. This will require maximum participation from each team and make it easier to organize and function.

Wilma Berry, Beth Bass, and Brenda Hester are on our fellowship committee and they are looking at ways to improve our events and make sure they are what they are called – Fellowships. Any ideas or suggestions please don't hesitate to mention it to them. — Ted Norton
