Budget Area of Work Spotlight

The Education program can be considered the bedrock of church activity, with one of the most dedicated groups of (volunteer) teachers to be found. Anyone who is reached by the services of Eastern Meadows benefits in some way from our provision for Bible teaching. Deacon Steve Housley helps guide the program with continuity and coordination. Deacon Allen Clements is working with curriculum and organizational matters. Deacon Joel Kelly serves as a dedicated problem solver for 6th grade and under classes. Becky Norton serves as the Elementary Coordinator. Minister of Education Dr. David Hester coordinates the entire program with meetings, planning, and arrangements for speakers and special events.

The budget for Education is significant but not complicated. There is an area for salary and benefits for the Education minister, an area for books and materials for classes, an area for outside speakers and special events, and a new area for sending some people with younger children to Lads to Leaders. In 2020 the total budget for Education is \$34,200, reflecting the wide reach of the program. — Alan Kaye
