Big Boy Tripp. Tripp (Dexter Hart, III) has been on our prayer list since he was born three months premature. Please read the following from his mother, Alyssa Johnson, about how he is doing and the immediate prayer needs! This is Patrice McClain's grandson.

Tripp is one day shy of being 6 months old (3 month adjusted!!)

He has been doing well. Tripp is definitely growing like a wildflower; currently he's 8lbs and 7oz. He loves his snuggles.

Tripp is still on the ventilator and on pretty high settings. Tripp has bronchopulmonary dysplasia (BPD) which is also referred to as chronic lung disease (CLD). BPD is common in premature babies, their air sacs are "damaged" and aren't able to move air like they should. Due to his BPD/CLD and the pulmonary hypertension, his lungs need more time to heal and grow.

For the last month we've had to decide what the next step would be for our little fighter. With a lot of prayer, support from other parents, and bugging our nurses and doctors from Pensacola, we've decided the best option would be for Tripp to have a tracheotomy. The trach would allow our wild boy to be more mobile, to sit up, be held when he wants to without worrying about him losing his airway (currently we can only hold once a day and sometimes not even that if Tripp is being super active.) We also feel that he would be more comfortable without having the tube constantly down his throat.

Since he will have the trach we will also require a g-tube/button. This will allow for him to get his milk directly at his stomach until his ventilator settings are low enough for him to be able to have food by mouth. Tripp will also get his hernias repaired and his laser eye surgery, due to retinopathy of prematurity.

Surgery is scheduled for Friday at 11am. We will update his page pre-op and post-op.

As always we are asking for our prayer warriors to pray for our strong baby. We thank each and everyone of you all for your prayers, calls, texts, and donations. We wouldn't have made it six months without our incredible support system. SERIOUSLY THANK YOU
